Supervisor Oliverio opened the Work Session at 6:00 p.m.

Pledge of Allegiance and moment of silence for our service men and women.

SUPERVISORS OPENING COMMENTS

Presented by Supervisor Oliverio

The meeting tonight is not live this evening due to the terrible storm we had which affected the audio/video equipment, but we are working on getting it on Channel 20 as quickly as possible.

Tomorrow, July 13th, is the vote for the Recreation Center at the P.V. Ambulance Corp. from 6:00AM to 9:00 PM. I hope you all go out and put forward your voice because your vote is your voice. We have received many comments both pro and con, - there are many people who are very eager to see this built and those who do not. However you vote – vote!

BUDGET PRESENTATION: O'CONNOR DAVIES

Presented by Supervisor Oliverio

Supervisor Oliverio introduced Partner, Chris Kopf and Senior Manager, Larry Feldman from our external audit firm O'Connor Davies. They started their presentation and 2016 financial results by saying that the Town Board will be pleased with the results of the Town's 2016 financial audit. On the first page of the audit report that they read at the podium they explained that they gave their "unmodified opinion", which is also known as a "clean opinion" and it is the highest level of assurance that they can give to a client.

Mr. Kopf made a point of noting that there was a zero accounting pronouncement which affected our LOSAP (which is for our Volunteer Fire Department) which has now, for clarity, been reclassified and folded into our Fire District - so this does affect the Town's overall net position. On page 25, the types of funds held by the town are described. On page 38 it shows the Town has very little debt. In 2018 the bond that the Town does have will be paid off. Supervisor Oliverio said that is why now is a good time to pass the Rec Center, because that bond will soon be paid off, and we would have hopefully had a good rating and gotten a very low interest rate on a new bond. Mr. Kopf referred to page 44, where the New York State Pension System is now listed on our financial statements. "This helps you plan for the future by being able to see what the liability rate is based on the current discount rate and what it would be if the discount rate changes. It is currently at 7%."

Mr. Feldman spoke about our Primary Operating Fund – which is the General Fund. Based on planned spending versus what was actually spent and what was brought in we show a positive fund balance of \$616,000.00. Mr. Feldman focused on two (2) areas that helped make this happen. One (1) is the increase in license and permit fees due to the increase of inspection fees in the Building Department and the high amount of construction going on in Town. The other is State Aid - Supervisor Oliverio asked if State Aid will be lowered for 2018? Mr. Kopf said income tax and sales tax is coming in slightly lower this year than anticipated. There may be pressure on the state budget in the future but it is not known right now. Mr. Feldman discussed the Highway Fund which showed a favorable increase of \$234,000.00 in fund balance. The total revenues came in at \$99,000.00 less than final budget because of the transportation services line to other governments - which are really the fuel that is used – so this is due to lower fuel costs, and less consumption. On page 68 - the Special Districts Fund – this is where the Fire Protection District is reported and where the effects of accounting change noted earlier can be seen.

The Town Board appropriated \$80,000.00 out of last year's positive fund balance to help reduce taxes to make it easier on the taxpayers. It was used to balance the budget.

Mr. Kopf said we have a nice healthy fund balance, and you did a good job staying within budget. Supervisor Oliverio thanked Maria Angelico for doing such a good job and also mentioned the Department Heads for being so vigilant.

Mr. Kopf did point out that our payroll system is archaic and it would be good to consider updating in the future. Ms. Angelico mentioned that she would be consulting with her counterparts in other Towns to begin researching new programs. Mr. Kopf also mentioned that the functions of payroll processing and check writing should be separate. Ms. Angelico responded that those functions are separated to the extent possible given current staff. Our procurement policy is also out of date, and will be revised before the next review. Town Attorney, William Florence, will work on this.
