Supervisor Oliverio opened the Regular Town Board Meeting and welcomed everyone.

Pledge of Allegiance and moment of silence for our Armed Forces throughout the world.

PROCLAMATIONS FOR TWO RETIRING EMPLOYEES

Presented by Supervisor Oliverio

Councilwoman Annabi (Supervisor Elect) presented and read the Town's Proclamation to retiring Children's Center Director, and Day Camp Director, Lisa Kroohs.

Councilwoman Annabi said Ms. Kroohs will be sorely missed as she has worked for our Town for over 30 years. Councilwoman Annabi then read a Proclamation to Ms. Kroohs from Senator Serino thanking her for her long and valued service to the Town of Putnam Valley.

County Legislator William Gouldman and New York State Assemblyman Kevin Byrne next honored Ms. Kroohs with Proclamations in appreciation for all of her hard work and dedication. Assemblyman Byrne gave Ms. Kroohs a Challenge Coin to challenge her to continue her service to our great town after her retirement.

Supervisor Oliverio said to Ms. Kroohs, we go way back together and you have been a focused and hard-working individual. Your innovative programs and consideration for the kids brought a small program to one (1) of the more popular programs at our schools. You built our day camp into a positive fun experience. You also powered through Covid. You have been a tremendous asset to our Town.

Councilwoman Annabi then asked Supervisor Oliverio to come to the podium. Councilwoman Annabi read a Proclamation from the State in appreciation for all of his vears in Public Service. She also gave him a plaque from the Town Board thanking him. Councilwoman Annabi said we will all miss him very much.

County Legislator William Gouldman and New York State Assemblyman Kevin Byrne also came to the podium to honor Supervisor Oliverio. Assemblyman Byrne said that Supervisor Oliverio has been an absolute pleasure to work with. He added that Putnam Valley is a shining example of a place where party really doesn't matter. His strongest relationship in the County is with Supervisor Oliverio which is a testament to his work ethic and passion in putting people before anything political. Assemblyman Byrne gave Supervisor Oliverio a Proclamation from the State and a Challenge Coin. Assemblyman Byrne said he has no doubt that Supervisor Oliverio will continue to serve his community in the future.

County Legislator Gouldman said thank you for Supervisor Oliverio's leadership, hard work, and dedication to Putnam Valley, Putnam County, and the United States for his time in the Military. Legislator Gouldman gave Supervisor Oliverio a Proclamation from County Executive Odell and himself, and County Legislator Montgomery.

Supervisor Oliverio said that he has been in government for 29 years. There has never been a moment that he has regretted joining the political arena or governmental work. He said you can't get closer to any community than to be involved in local government; or local not-for-profit groups. This is your Town and if you can give back even a little bit to the Town it does wonders for yourself, and is a shining example of what we can all do to make things better. He added that he will miss this place and you will still hear from me. Thank you!

Councilwoman Annabi said when she was first elected this woman came up to her and said, "Kid, it's you and me; they may have us beat, but we have the wits." The person who said that to her was Councilwoman Whetsel who will also be leaving us in December; the reason she said that was because there were more men than woman on the Town Board. Councilwoman Annabi said Councilwoman Whetsel has always been a strong supporter for the environment. She added that she is a great person to work with who taught her a lot. Councilwoman Annabi gave an appreciation plaque to Councilwoman Whetsel and said even though she lost; she never lost the support and appreciation from the Town Board. Thank you for all you have done for this Town.

Councilwoman Whetsel said how gratified she feels having gotten to work for this Town. She has been stretched in many different directions; and has been challenged with trying to solve and fix many problems in ways where we can all work together. She has loved and enjoyed every minute of her 16 years on the Town Board and thanked everyone for their support.

Councilwoman Annabi also announced the retirement of Highway Superintendent Larry Cobb who could not be at the meeting tonight. Councilwoman Annabi said she will get his Proclamations to him. Supervisor Oliverio read Superintendent Cobb's statement as follows:

"First, I would like to thank the Town Board for their continued support over these last 10 years. I ran for Highway Superintendent knowing that I could make a difference for this Town, and I believe I have done just that. Most importantly, I have always put the taxpayers and residents of this Town first and foremost. I thank you for your support. I will miss connecting with you and working for all the people, but what I will not miss is all the sleepless nights and worries!

Thank you to all the guys who have worked with me, and all the ones who have retired before me. Lastly I would like to thank my Secretary's Margaret Bradley and Alexis Acevedo for all of their hard work. I could not have done this job without their support and help.

As this chapter ends for me, another one will begin, I look forward to that... Who knows, maybe there will be a run for public office in my future, I am not ruling anything out."

State Assemblyman Byrne said that Superintendent Cobb went every year to Albany to advocate for CHIPS Funding and every dollar of CHIPS money received from the State is one (1) less dollar of tax money for the residents to pay. Superintendent Cobb is extremely well respected in the County as well as in the Town, and he has done a great service for this Town and will be greatly missed.

County Legislator Gouldman thanked Superintendent Cobb for his dedicated service. He added that Mr. Cobb's professionalism and dedication has led the Highway Department and Fire Department in a very positive way for our community. The Legislature also presented Superintendent Cobb with a Proclamation to thank him for his great work. County Legislator Gouldman also thanked Councilwoman Whetsel for her service and dedication to the Town of Putnam Valley. He said her hard work has helped to mold the Town Board and the Town in many positive ways. She will be missed.

Councilman Smith next came up to the podium to give a Proclamation to Town Attorney Bob Lusardi who is also retiring at the end of the year. Councilman Smith said Attorney Lusardi was involved in many things that took place in the Town and even though he has plenty of wisdom and knowledge; what was most impressive was his amount of preparation. Councilman Smith said he has never met another lawyer more prepared than Bob Lusardi. He always comes to the table with incredible preparation and has set a very high bar for anyone who comes after him. Councilman Smith read the Proclamation to him. Town Attorney Lusardi said the time that he has spent here has been the most rewarding of his career. He added, thank you for the opportunity and wished everyone well.

Supervisor Oliverio thanked everyone who works in Town Hall and keeps this Town afloat. God bless everyone and he will miss the Town Employees the most.

"This year has been another difficult year with the pandemic still challenging our agency and community. As we head into the last month of the year, we urge everyone to stay vigilant to keep yourselves and your families safe."

"We still have some addresses that are difficult to see from the roadway. If you have a mailbox, please be sure your house number is on both sides of your box. If your address is only on your house make sure it is clearly visible and large enough to see from the street or install a house number at the end of your driveway. When there is an emergency at your home, we want to be able to locate your residence immediately."

"Also, with the winter weather heading our way please try to clear your driveways, sidewalks and steps as soon as possible so those hazards do not impede the crew working to get patients from their home to the rig and ultimately to the hospital. We wish everyone a safe, happy and healthy holiday season.
