# (A) APPROVE APPLICATION FOR WATER INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT ACT GRANT PROGRAM. AUTHORIZING THE TOWN SUPERVISOR TO APPLY FOR A GRANT TO THE NEW YORK STATE ENVIRONMENTAL FACILITIES CORPORATION UNDER THE NEW YORK STATE WATER INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT ACT (WIIA)

#### **RESOLUTION #R22-284**

WHEREAS, the Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) is soliciting applications through the Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) for clean and drinking water improvement projects; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Putnam Valley has an identifiable need to replace the Oregon Corners pump station and install a new sewer main in Lake Peekskill; and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the improvements is estimated to be \$3,984,000.00; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Putnam Valley is requesting \$996,000.00 in grant funding through the WIIA program with a committed 75% grant match of \$2,988,000.00 from incurred debt;

**BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Town Board of the Town of Putnam Valley does hereby authorize the Town Supervisor to submit an application to the Environmental Facilities Corporation through the Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) Grant Program to fund necessary infrastructure improvements to the Pump Station at Oregon Corners and the installation of a new sewer main in Lake Peekskill and to execute any formal agreements and associated documents with EFC as part of the funding agreement.

# (B.) APPROVE APPLICATION FOR WATER INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT ACT GRANT PROGRAM. SEQRA RESOLUTION – WIIA GRANT

#### **RESOLUTION #R22-285**

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Putnam Valley has authorized by Resolution #R22-285 of 2022 an application for a NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation WIIA program grant of \$996,000.00, which is proposed to be combined with a 75% grant match of \$2,988,000.00 from incurred debt, for the Oregon Corners Pump Station Replacement, and Lake Peekskill Sewer Main Installation Project; and

**WHEREAS**, a completed environmental review is required at time of application submission;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that said capital project has been determined to be an Unlisted Action pursuant to the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and Full Environmental Assessment Form (FEAF) is annexed hereto; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Town Board refers this matter to the Putnam County Department of Planning, Development and Public Transportation for a recommendation pursuant to GML §239-m.

Seconded by Councilman Russo;

(C.) APPROVE APPLICATION FOR WATER INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENT ACT GRANT PROGRAM. BOND RESOLUTION, DATED SEPTEMBER 7, 2022, AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$2,988,000.00 AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT SERIAL BONDS OF THE TOWN OF PUTNAM VALLEY, COUNTY OF PUTNAM, STATE OF NEW YORK, PURSUANT TO THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW, TO FINANCE THE REPLACEMENT OF THE OREGON CORNERS PUMP STATION AND THE INSTALLATON OF THE LAKE PEEKSKILL SEWER MAIN

#### **RESOLUTION #R22-286**

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Putnam Valley (the "Town"), located in the County of Putnam, in the State of New York (the "State"), hereby determines that it is in the Public interest of the Town to authorize the financing of the costs of the replacement of the Oregon Corners Pump Station and the installation of the Lake Peekskill Sewer Main, including any preliminary and incidental costs related thereto, at a total cost not to exceed \$3,984,000.00 all in accordance with the Local Finance Law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that there is hereby authorized to be issued serial bonds of the Town in the aggregate principal amount of \$2,988,000.00, pursuant to the Local Finance Law, in order to finance the costs of the replacement of the Oregon Corners Pump Station and the installation of the Lake Peekskill sewer main, including any preliminary and incidental costs related thereto (the "project").

Seconded by Councilman Luongo for discussion.

Councilman Luongo said that three (3) million dollars for the people of Lake Peekskill to spend when not very many people would benefit from the project seems like a lot of money. The sewer line would only extend to the top of Morrissey Drive. Supervisor Annabi said that the grant is only for 25% of the 4 million dollar cost and the District would be responsible for the other 75% which is three (3) million dollars. She first assumed it was the other way around; and agreed with Councilman Luongo. The Town Board decided that was too much money for the District to incur and removed this Resolution from the agenda (see below). With this Resolution removed the previous two (2) Resolutions were rendered useless and were rescinded as well. (see below).

# SET PUBLIC HEARING FOR SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR HOMELAND TOWERS ON PORTERS ROAD

#### RESOLUTION # 2%OF 2022

WHEREAS, Homeland Towers, LLC, and T-Mobile Northeast LLC d/b/a T-Mobile ("the applicant"), have applied for a Special Use Permit to construct a personal wireless service facility consisting of a 150' tall monopole tower and associated equipment to be located within a 2,650 square foot fenced compound area. The site is currently improved with a single-family residence and detached garage which will be demolished as part of the proposed action. The tower is designed to accommodate four carriers ("the proposed action"); and

WHEREAS, the proposed action was determined to be an Unlisted Action under New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) and a coordinated review was conducted; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant obtained a Negative Declaration from the Putnam Valley Planning Board on August 15, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Applicant obtained Conditional Site Plan Approval from the Planning Board on August 15, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the proposed use is a Special Permit Use within the underlying R-3 Zoning District and is subject to the provisions of Town Code §165-61 ("Personal wireless service facilities and towers"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Town Code §165-61, the Town Board shall review applications for a Special Use Permit.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Town Board hereby sets a public hearing on the proposed Special Use Permit for October 19, 2022, at 6:00pm, or as soon thereafter as the matter may come to

be heard, in the Town Hall, 265 Oscawana Lake Road, Putnam Valley, New York; and

- The Town Board refers this matter to the Putnam County Department of Planning,
   Development and Public Transportation for a recommendation pursuant to GML §239-m; and
- 3. The Town Board directs the Town Clerk to notify the Town Clerks of each of the surrounding municipalities of the public hearing pursuant to GML §239-nn.
