The Parks and Recreation Department request you accept the proposal from CEMCO Water & Wastewater Specialists, Inc. not to exceed (NTE) \$310,000 to repair the camp water system that was damaged during the July 9 storm, located at the Town Camp Facility, 140 Brookfalls, Putnam Valley, NY 10579.

RE: Emergency design build for pipe crossing and tank relining.

Cemco will provide all labor, equipment and materials to engineer, fabricate and install support truss style pipe and pedestrian support bridge across creek at the location of previous crossing damaged by stormwater level.

Scope of work: Cemco is pleased to present the following agreement for the immediate design, engineering, fabrication, and installation of potable water piping and support bridge with protective fencing at each end with access gates. As discussed at our site walk through inspection, the town will provide access to the currently inaccessible portion of the work area. The work on pipe, tanks, and bridges require special training, equipment and certifications. All personnel will be certified for 30 hour OSHA construction safety and health, 62 hour site safety supervisor, permit required for required confined space entry, competent person fall protection, rigging and scaffolding use.

Experienced technicians will design, engineer and fabricate a 36" wide truss bridge in sections offsite. Specialized trucks, boom, and welding equipment will, negotiate the trail to the jobsite. Crew will connect sections of truss bridge on jobsite and boom over waterway. Sections of 4" stainless steel pipe will be welded in place to span the waterway with seamless pipe supported by the truss bridge. Security fencing with gates will be fabricated and installed on each approach to bridge to prevent unwanted access.

Pricing for the permanent coating of the water storage tank is also included as washouts have caused the tanks rusted areas to leak.

Fabrication and installation of truss bridge and piping

Mobilization and de-mobilization begins when materials are delivered to facility for fabrication.

A Health and Safety Plan will be created for this project in advance of our fieldwork. Technicians will also document a "toolbox type" worksite safety meeting at the start of each shift. Fall protection will be utilized to prevent personnel from entering the waterway. A Small boat and life jackets will be onsite for the duration of the project.

Experienced iron workers will design and fabricate a new 36" wide by 80' long accents and support bridge along with all associated anchors and supports to accommodate attachment to 6'x6'x8" steel reinforced concrete capitals installed while fabrication occurs. Fabricate and install fencing with gates to prevent unwanted entry to crossing. Custom handrails will be installed to safely access bridge when needed for winterization and future repairs. A specialized high adhesion, zero VOC coating will be applied to all exposed steel as needed.

Crew will furnish and install 120' of 4" stainless steel (304)s piping welded along with Victaulic transition fitting to connect to existing piping. Blow off, drain down valves and hose connections will be supplied for isolation and winterization of all installed piping.

All equipment and experienced operators, capable of negotiating trail and booming materials for placement across waterway. Support vehicles as needed to assist will be provided as the current condition of trail to site is less than satisfactory for a project of this nature.

Cost: \$183,000.00 (pricing does not include applicable taxes)

coating of water storage tank

A health and safety plan will be created for this project in advance of our fieldwork. Documented "toolbox type" safety meeting will be held prior to start of each days work.

Certified technicians will use a confined space entry permit before tank is accessed. Ventilator and 4 gas detector, harness and retrieval system will be utilized. Technicians will perform lockout tagout procedure when needed.

Experienced technicians will properly prepare the surface to exceed manufactures specifications for adhesion. No grinding of hot work will be performed(high pressure water, bristle blaster or needle gun). Crew will utilize vacuum unit to remove all sludge, scale and debris for proper transportation and disposal. Power and water will need to be available near the work area by the facility. A specially designed and nsf-61 approved chemical to remove the bio-film and prevent under film corrosion will be applied in advance of the epoxy coating. An nsf-61 approved chemical to prevent flash rust will be applied prior to coating. Manufacturers certified technicians will permanently apply the approved specially designed nsf-61 approved, non-toxic, odorless, non-flammable structural coating, this coating has no VOC's.

Manufacturers certified technicians will permanently apply multiple layers of a specially impregnated carbon-fiber reinforced polymer to the defective perimeter of the bottom of the tank to provide and permanent structural repair of the compromised steel.

Cost: \$118,000.00 (pricing does not include applicable taxes)

Notes and exclusions:

The full scope of work is listed above. Based on our experience other requirements can arise during any project; the following is a list of possible additional tasks that may be required to complete the project, but which are not included in the pricing: notifying of tenants, repairing additional plumbing in the area, transportation /disposal of hazardous, regulated or contaminated materials, the use of local union or coalition workforce, excavation or rehabilitation of underground piping, installation of water alarms, electrical work, improvements to access road or trail.

Payment terms require 50% retainer and the balance due within 30 days after completion.

Landwork Contractors, Inc. submits its proposal to include all labor, material, equipment and clean up necessary to complete the following scope of work at Children's Beach Roaring Brook Lake:

- 1. Cut down and remove trees/stumps in the way of the new walkway from the main walkway to the garbage enclosures.
- 2. Excavate, install and compact a new item-4 gravel sub-base approximately 4" thick in the footprint of the new path.
- 3. Re-grade and compact the existing item-4 gravel in the footprint of the existing path. Install and compact additional item-4 gravel to maintain a minimum 4" thickness of sub-base.
- 4. Install a new layer of hot mix top coat asphalt 3" thick. The total length of the walkway including the side that branches off to the garbage enclosures is approximately 178'. The width of the walkways will be 4'.
- 5. Clean up and remove construction debris off site.
- 6. Rake and re-seed disturbed soil areas on the sides of the new walkway.
- 7. The asphalt will be pitched to the vegetated slope area by creating a swale in the asphalt approximately every 30'-40'.

- 4. Fill the paver joints with chip stone permeable gravel. Install mortar around the edges of the patio.
- 5. Rake and reseed disturbed lawn areas from patio construction.

The current estimate for such repairs is \$4,032,000 for roads, \$2,950,500 for bridges and retaining walls, \$600,000 for Town buildings, and \$917,500 for Parks & Recreation facilities. A portion of the disbursement required for repairs will be reimbursed to the Town through FEMA relief funds. The Biden Administration granted public assistance to Putnam County in the wake of the extensive damage incurred throughout the county during the storm, however, the Town must outlay these costs upfront, and apply for reimbursement accordingly.

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Putnam Valley (the "Town"), located in the County of Putnam, in the State of New York (the "State"), hereby determines that it is in the public interest of the Town to authorize the financing of the costs of (i) improvements to roads (\$4,032,000), (ii) improvements to bridges and retaining walls (\$2,950,500), (iii) improvements to Town buildings (\$600,000), and (iv) improvements to parks and recreation facilities (\$917,500), all in and for the Town, including any applicable equipment, machinery, apparatus, land or rights-in-land necessary therefor and any preliminary and incidental costs related thereto, at a total cost not to exceed \$8,500,000, all in accordance with the Local Finance Law;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Board of the Town of Putnam Valley, County of Putnam, State of New York, as follows:

Section 1. There is hereby authorized to be issued serial bonds of the Town in the aggregate principal amount of up to \$8,500,000, pursuant to the Local Finance Law, in order to finance the costs of the specific objects or purposes hereinafter described.

Section 2. The specific objects or purposes, or class of objects or purposes, to be financed pursuant to this bond resolution (collectively, the "Project"), the respective estimated maximum cost of such specific object or purpose, or class of object or purpose, the principal amount of serial bonds authorized herein for such specific object or purpose, or class of object or purpose, and the period of

probable usefulness of such specific object or purpose, or class of object or purpose, thereof pursuant to the applicable subdivision of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance law, are as follows:

- (a) The reconstruction of and improvements to roads in and for the Town, including any applicable equipment, machinery, apparatus, land or rights-in-land necessary therefor and any preliminary and incidental costs related thereto, at an estimated maximum cost of \$4,032,000, for which \$4,032,000 principal amount of serial bonds, or bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds, are authorized herein and appropriated therefore, having a period of probable usefulness of fifteen (15) years pursuant to subdivision 20(c) of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law. Such serial bonds shall have a maximum maturity of five (5) years computed from the earlier of (a) the date of the first issue of such serial bonds or (b) the date of the first issue of bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds; and therefor and any preliminary and incidental costs related thereto, at an estimated maximum cost of \$2,950,500, for which \$2,950,500 principal amount of serial bonds, or bond anticipation notes issued
- (b) The reconstruction of and improvements to bridges and retaining walls in and for the Town, including any applicable equipment, machinery, apparatus, land or rights-in-land necessary therefor or preliminary or incidental costs related thereto, at an estimated maximum cost of \$2,950,500, for which \$2,950,500 principal amount of serial bonds, or bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds, are authorized herein and appropriated therefor, having a period of probable usefulness of twenty (20) years pursuant to subdivision 10 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law. Such serial bonds shall have a maximum maturity of five (5) years computed from the earlier of (a) the date of the first issue of such serial bonds or (b) the date of the first issue of bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds; and

- (c) The reconstruction of and improvements to Town buildings, including any applicable equipment, machinery, apparatus, land or rights-in-land necessary therefor and any preliminary and incidental costs related thereto, at an estimated maximum cost of \$600,000, for which \$600,000 principal amount of serial bonds, or bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds, are authorized herein and appropriated therefore, having a period of probable usefulness of fifteen (15) years pursuant to subdivision 12(a)(2) of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law. Such serial bonds shall have a maximum maturity of five (5) years computed from the earlier of (a) the date of the first issue of such serial bonds or (b) the date of the first issue of bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds; and
- (d) The reconstruction of and improvements to parks and recreation facilities in and for the Town, including any applicable equipment, machinery, apparatus, land or rights-in-land necessary therefor or any preliminary or incidental costs related thereto, at an estimated maximum cost of \$917,500, for which \$917,500 principal amount of serial bonds, or bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds, are authorized herein and appropriated therefor, having a period of probable usefulness of fifteen (15) years pursuant to subdivision 19(c) of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law. Such serial bonds shall have a maximum maturity of five (5) years computed from the earlier of (a) the date of the first issue of such serial bonds or (b) the date of the first issue of bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds;
- Section 3. The Town Board of the Town has ascertained and hereby states that (a) the estimated maximum cost of the Project is \$8,500,000; (b) no money has heretofore been authorized to be applied to the payment of the costs of the Project; (c) the Town Board of the Town plans to finance the costs of the Project from (i) the proceeds of the serial bonds authorized herein, or from the

proceeds of bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of such serial bonds, (ii) certain federal and New York State grants, which shall reduce the amounts authorized herein *pro tanto*, and (iii) the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the Town to pay the principal of said bonds or bond anticipation notes and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable; (d) the maturity of the obligations authorized herein may not be in excess of five (5) years; and (e) on or before the expenditure of moneys to pay for any costs of the Project, for which proceeds of such obligations are to be applied to reimburse the Town, the Town Board of the Town took "official action" for federal income tax purposes to authorize capital financing of such item.

Section 4. Subject to the terms and conditions of this bond resolution and the Local Finance Law, including the provisions of Sections 21.00, 30.00, 50.00 and 56.00 to 60.00, inclusive, the power to authorize the serial bonds authorized herein, and bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds, including renewals thereof, the power to prescribe the terms, form and contents of such serial bonds and such bond anticipation notes, and the power to issue, sell and deliver such serial bonds and such bond anticipation notes, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, as the chief fiscal officer of the Town. The Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of the Town, all serial bonds authorized herein and all bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds, and the Town Clerk is hereby authorized to affix the seal of the Town (or attach a facsimile thereof) on all such serial bonds and bond anticipation notes and to attest such seal. Each interest coupon, if any, representing interest payable on such serial bonds shall be authenticated by the manual or facsimile signature of the Town Supervisor.

Section 5. Each of the serial bonds authorized by this bond resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law. The faith and credit of the Town is hereby and shall be irrevocably pledged for the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on all obligations authorized and issued pursuant to this bond resolution as the same shall become due.

Section 6. When this bond resolution takes effect, the Town Clerk shall cause the same, or a summary thereof, to be published together with a notice in substantially the form prescribed by Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law in ________, a newspaper having a general circulation in the Town. The validity of the serial bonds authorized by this bond resolution, and of bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of such serial bonds, may be contested only if such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose, or class of object or purpose, for which the Town is not authorized to expend money, or the provisions of law which should have been complied with as of the date of the publication of this bond resolution, or such summary thereof, were not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty (20) days after the date of such publication, or if such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution of the State.

Section 7. Prior to the issuance of the obligations authorized herein, the Town Board of the Town shall comply with all applicable provisions prescribed in Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law, all regulations promulgated thereunder by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, and all applicable Federal laws and regulations in connection with environmental quality review relating to the Project (collectively, the

"environmental compliance proceedings"). In the event that any of the environmental compliance proceedings are not completed, or require amendment or modification subsequent to the date of adoption of this bond resolution, the Town Board of the Town will re-adopt, amend or modify this bond resolution prior to the issuance of the obligations authorized herein upon the advice of bond counsel. It is hereby determined by the Town Board of the Town that the Project will not have a significant effect on the environment.

Section 8. The Town hereby declares its intention to issue the obligations authorized herein to finance the costs of the Project. The proceeds of any obligations authorized herein may be applied to reimburse expenditures or commitments of the Town made with respect to the Project on or after a date which is not more than sixty (60) days prior to the date of adoption of this bond resolution by the Town.

Section 9. For the benefit of the holders and beneficial owners from time to time of the obligations authorized herein, the Town agrees in accordance with and as an obligated person with respect to the obligations under Rule 15c2-12 promulgated by the Securities Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the "Rule"), to provide or cause to be provided such financial information and operating data, financial statements and notices, in such manner, as may be required for purposes of the Rule. In order to describe and specify certain terms of the Town's continuing disclosure agreement for that purpose, and thereby to implement that agreement, including provisions for enforcement, amendment and termination, the Town Supervisor is authorized and directed to sign and deliver, in the name and on behalf of the Town, the commitment authorized by subsection 6(c) of the Rule (the "Commitment") to be placed on file with the Town Clerk, which shall constitute the continuing disclosure agreement made by the

Town for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of the obligations authorized herein in accordance which the Rule, with any changes or amendments that are not inconsistent with this bond resolution and not substantially adverse to the Town and that are approved by the Town Supervisor on behalf of the Town, all of which shall be conclusively evidenced by the signing of the Commitment or amendments thereto. The agreement formed collectively by this paragraph and the Commitment, shall be the Town's continuing disclosure agreement for purposes of the Rule, and its performance shall be subject to the availability of funds and their annual appropriation to meet costs the Town would be required to incur to perform thereunder. The Town Supervisor is further authorized and directed to establish procedures in order to ensure compliance by the Town with its continuing disclosure agreement, including the timely provision of information and notices. Prior to making any filing in accordance with the agreement or providing notice of the occurrence of any material event, the Town Supervisor shall consult with, as appropriate, the Town Attorney and bond counsel or other qualified independent special counsel to the Town and shall be entitled to rely upon any legal advice provided by the Town Attorney or such bond counsel or other qualified independent special counsel in determining whether a filing should be made.

Section 10. This bond resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the Town Board of the Town.
