I'm glad to announce after over a year of planning, we will be getting both playgrounds refurbished. Essentially, everything will be replaced along with some additional equipment. I will be posting most of the equipment as well as the construction dates on our website and our social media pages. Work will begin around April 1st and hopefully will take approximately 2 weeks.

The cafeteria refurbish has already begun and we are hoping for a May completion date. Again, this will be an upgrade of windows, doors and floors with the hopes of eventually making it another rental space in town when the camp is not running.

All these are being funded through grants and ARPA, in which our Town Supervisor, Town Board and my office have worked diligently on, so thankfully there will be no tax impact.

Highway Superintendent Keeler gave the following report:

I'd like to take a moment to thank the men and women of the Highway Department for their continued hard work and dedication.

We have been out cold patching as needed.

We have been out and will continue to be cutting dead trees.

We added 3 basins and 196 feet of 12 in pipe to alleviate a water issue on Point Drive in Lake Peekskill. We also added a basin and 80 feet of 2 inch pipe on Peekskill Hollow Turnpike to alleviate a major erosion problem.

Our Vac-all has started going around. They completed all basins of Barger Street and Wood Street areas and have begun the Lake Peekskill area. So far we have clean basins as well as gutters on the sides of the roads. So far we cleaned out 144 basins.

With getting such an early jump on basins this year we should be able to get the basins in lake communities cleaned twice this year.

If any residents are interested in getting un-split firewood please contact us.

With the first of two of the blacktop plants opening Monday we will begin blacktop patching.

Speaking of blacktop, I met with both the Black Top and Milling companies; we drove all over Town. Hopefully, by beginning of April we will know how much CHIPS money we will be getting from the State. CHIPS is money that the State reimburses the towns for blacktop repairs ETC. This is money, I, along with several Highway Superintendents in the State, spent a day in the Capital, advocating for on March 6th. Unofficial start to blacktopping will be the end of June, beginning of July. Once I have the figures I will present a list of roads we are blacktopping.

The phones at Highway are monitored 24/7 and I ask residents with issues to call us and not post on Facebook as we don't troll for complaints.

WHEREAS, the Town of Putnam Valley Town Board hereby proposes that certain Town Code local law amendments be made to Town Code Chapter 108, specifically, to add Article IX, entitled "Taxation of Hotel Room Occupancy" as authorized by NYS Tax Law §1202-Z-4; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is annexed hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein as if recited verbatim and the Town Board does direct that said amendment be spread across the record as if they, in fact, had been read verbatim; and

WHEREAS, this action to amend the Town Code is a Type II Action under the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) requiring no further environmental review; and

WHEREAS, the amendment requires a public hearing.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board hereby sets a public hearing on the proposed amendments for April 17, 2024, at 6 pm, or as soon thereafter as the matter may come to be heard, in the Town Hall, 265 Oscawana Lake Road, Putnam Valley, New York; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk is hereby directed to post and provide notice of the public hearing as required by law.

The utility side-water main to shut off valve, and customer side-shut off valve to and in customer's home. NYSDOH is requiring all information to be entered into a state designed spreadsheet by October 16, 2024.
