## PUBLIC HEARING: NEW YORK STATE OCCUPANCY TAX LAW

Presented by Supervisor Annabi

Supervisor Annabi said that as some people may remember, Assemblyman Matt Slater was here a few months ago and presented us with a signed agreement from our Governor that allows the Town to put in the Occupancy Tax for short term rentals, hotels, motels and occupancies of that type. The law has been posted. No questions were asked tonight.

Attorney Ryan stated "I feel the terms of the law speak for itself. There will be a process where you apply to be subject to this law."

This will remain open for written comments only until May 15<sup>th.</sup> All notices and any comments or concerns can be sent to the Town Board and/or the Town Clerk by 4 PM, May 14<sup>th</sup>. The public hearing will be closed on May 15<sup>th</sup> with a vote occurring the following month.

## Library Director Amina Chaudhri gave the following report:

So far in April we have had a wildly popular screening of Part 1 of a docuseries exploring the Singer/Actor Paul Robson and the Peekskill Riots.

Looking forward we have Kirtan with Jane on April 19th at 7pm. Kirtan is call and response chanting. Stitches with Stace is on pause for the next week, and is returning with an additional pop up event on one Saturday a month

Our other regular programs continue including Chess and Mahjong club, the HAM radio workshops, Sewing Guild, and the Loving Your Backyard series in conjunction with the Putnam Valley Commission for the Conservation of the Environment (CCE). CCE Seed to Supper is beginning Tuesday, April 16th, 7:00—8:30 PM.

The Putnam Valley Library Food Pantry has returned for the 2024 season and is stocked with some canned goods, juice, peanut butter and macaroni. We also have a freezer in our Community Room which is stocked with free frozen meals made locally by Second Chance Foods and supported by Cornell Cooperative Extension. We also have a free Seed Library which is also supported by Cornell Cooperative.

For children we have Theater Tuesdays, Cooking with Chef Sharon, Reading to Sunny Boy (the dog), high school math tutoring and storytimes. PV Elementary Kindergarten classes have been visiting and receiving a tour as well as their Library cards.

Putnam Valley Library also offers tech help, computer, fax and printer usage, museum passes, digital materials, wi-fi, EZ Pass purchases and more!

Concert will be posted on the website soon as we finalize some of the details. The first one will take place on Thursday, May 23<sup>rd</sup>. Our Independence Day event will also serve as one of the concerts in addition to the fireworks display on July 5<sup>th</sup>.

## Currently Running Programs

All programs can be found on our website at PVPR.com along with the registration process. Many of our summer programs are also out, so I urge people to get online or call the office sooner than later. Unfortunately, the days of late or last-minute registration have long been over as our programs fill up, and most of the time, just expanding them are not an option due to a variety of reasons such as space and staffing.

For example, our day camp is already at the 200-camper capacity and there is a waiting list, and expanding that is not an option without major work to the facility.

Highway Superintendent Keeler's report is as follows:

Good Evening Ladies and Gentlemen

I'd like to take a moment to thank the men and women of the Highway dept. for their continued hard work and dedication

We have been out and will continue to be cutting dead trees as needed.

We have added 3 basins and 215 feet of 12 inch pipe on walnut road in Lake Peekskill as well has drilled and split a lot of ledger rock which unfortunately has been slowing down the job.

We repaired Sunken Mine road going through the state park and have opened it for the season.

We also have been out repairing washouts on other dirt roads.

Our Mowing season began this morning; we are hoping that by getting an early start we will be able to stay on top of it

Our Vac-all has been out in the Lake Peekskill area cleaning basins as well as gutters on the sides of the roads. So far we cleaned out 333 Basins. With getting such an early jump on basins this year we should be able to get the basins in lake communities cleaned twice this year

We still are unsure of how much Chips money will be getting from the state. CHIPS is money that the State Reimburses the Towns for Blacktop repairs ETC. Once I have the figures I will present a list of roads we are blacktopping

The phones at highway are monitored 24 / 7 and I ask residents with issues to call us and not post on Facebook as we don't troll for complaints

As they were doing the work they came across a lot more ledge and rock than expected, so they had to increase the original contract price which was \$358,860 and it is going up \$61,200., so the total is \$420,060.

# CONTRACT FOR RENTAL OF SCHOOL BUSES

# ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS AND TERMS

Illegal behavior and Intoxicants - Intoxicants and illegal substances including but not limited to alcohol, inhalants, marijuana, cocaine, LSD, PCP, amphetamines, heroin, steroids, look alike drugs, and any synthetic version thereof (whether or not specifically illegal or labeled for human consumption), commonly referred to as "designer drugs" shall not be brought onto school district facilities or buses at any time. Profanity, objectionable language, disorderly acts or illegal activities of any kind are absolutely prohibited and those violating this prohibition will be ejected.

## APPROVE UNPAID LEAVE OF ABSENCE FOR HIGHWAY EMPLOYEE

### **RESOLUTION #R24-195**

**RESOLVED**, that the Town Board approve a two (2) week unpaid leave of absence for a Highway employee. The employee wrote that he has been working for the Highway Department for a little over one year and he and his wife are expecting their second child, due April 30<sup>th</sup>. He is requesting two (2) weeks unpaid paternity leave (April 29<sup>th</sup> to May 17<sup>th</sup>, 2024) Dates may be fluid depending upon actual DOB, and he will contact Superintendent Keeler of any necessary adjustments.

Supervisor Annabi said he was looking for FMLA (Family Medical Leave Act). Putnam Valley does not opt into the NYS paid family leave because our employees have an option of comp, sick, personal and vacation time. We do opt into FMLA because it is Federal and we have to do that. Under FMLA, employees are entitled to time off but must use their vacation time first. This employee has this time: three (3) days comp and five (5) vacation days and other personal time available to him, but he does not want to use it or FMLA. He is only requesting two (2) weeks off without pay. If he uses FMLA he is entitled to twelve (12) weeks, but must use his vacation time.

Councilman Luongo said if one is having a child and has the time, why not want a check coming in. Also, if we grant this one time, how many more times will we have to grant this to others?

Councilwoman Howard said he also has a contract, so whatever it says in the contract is what we have to honor. If it doesn't say that in the contract, how can we honor it?

Councilwoman Tompkins said we have to be consistent.

Supervisor Annabi said if approved, this could be a hardship on the Highway Department and crews and it sets a precedent for anyone wanting to take off.

Councilman Russo asked Superintendent Keeler if he is short a man, does he have to give other employees overtime to cover his hours?

Superintendent Keeler that since he has been in charge, when employees have asked for time off, they were told they had to use their time.

Superivisor Annabi asked "Is it a decision of this Board that we are not going to grant him unpaid leave while he has time?" All agreed and she said she will let him know

tomorrow. Under this procedure he can use FMLA but must use his vacation or comp time and he must give his supervisor 30 days notice. Therefore, under this procedure now he cannot use FMLA.

Supervisor Annabi made a motion to deny the request for unpaid leave.
