Good evening, ladies and Gentlemen

I'd like to take a moment to thank the men and women of the Highway dept. for their continued hard work and dedication.

I think winter is over!

We added pad rock gravel to 500 feet of the ditch line on Indian hill Road to avoid cars going off as well as 200 feet of 12-inch pipe to a ditch line on wood street where we also added the pad rock gravel.

We have been out repairing dirt roads

We began repairing lawns and intersections that were damaged in the winter while plowing snow.

We have been out cold patching and are meeting with Blacktop contractor next week and will have Blacktop list finalized soon after, with hopes the New York State Budget is passed soon we will know if we will get a raise in state funding for blacktop. we are on schedule to take place at end of June beginning of July.

We have a crew out hammering some ledge rock along roads this will not only assist us when plowing but also takes away danger of residents hitting them with the cars also some points will help with site vision.

Brookfalls Rd culvert project bid continues. Cimarron Rd culvert project will be starting soon and we will keep everyone posted when start and completion dates are figured out. Horton Hollow and New hill culvert projects are in design phase

We hoping to get our basin cleaning crew and Basin repair crew out soon but can't risk the machine freezing as temps are still too cold in the morning.

I received a phone call a few weeks ago about possible changes to Adams Corners after meeting with Putnam County DPW it was decided that the requested changes were not only unsafe but cost would be astronomical.

The phones at highway are monitored 24 / 7 and I ask residents with issues to call us and not post on Facebook as we don't troll for complaints. As well be sure to go on Town of Putnam Valley Highway Department Facebook page and like it to stay on top of all the doings of the Highway Dept.

### **Supervisor Jolicoeur opened the floor**

I just want to give a huge thank you to the highway department and all of our volunteers at the ambulance corps and the fire department. This winter was no joke, so thank you for all of your efforts in keeping us safe. And also really wanted to just thank all of the board members, our new town council, everybody that's just really been working together at Putnam Valley. We've also been having bi-weekly meetings with department heads and consultants, which has been great. We've been providing all of that information and minutes to the board so that they can stay abreast of what we're doing here at Town Hall. And so, I really want to thank everybody for working together with me to move things forward. We reconfigured our assessor's office. We appointed a new, highly qualified assessor as well as an assessor's clerk, which was amazing to do while at the same time passing the new senior and veterans' exemption. So, I was very happy that we managed to do that. We also recently had a very successful district meeting for Lake Peekskill. There was a number of issues going on there, and we really had a packed house here. Very happy about that, as well as we had the different lake committees come together to re-envision the Commission of Lakes. And again, that was very well attended, and everybody provided a lot of very meaningful feedback and information. So, it's an example of my commitment to continue to collaborate, and I'd like to give a shout out to Mr. Joseph Cipollini, who is the Watershed Inspector of the City of Peekskill, who attended both of those meetings. And it was great to introduce him to the community and to give him an opportunity to provide his feedback. I was just today on a meeting with Joe and others, and this is an example of the intermunicipal collaboration that I hope to continue as we broaden the scope and look to ways to protect and improve the quality of our watershed, which goes beyond municipal boundaries and beyond county boundaries. So that is very promising and I'm very much looking forward to continuing all of that. And with my commitment to transparency, I have continued to inform the public with regular news updates as well as my monthly newsletter. So please, the website is still a work in progress, however you can find those news updates on the homepage, just below the supervisor section. I've been continuing to put information out on our new official Facebook page. And again, I continue that commitment to transparency and getting information out to the people. When Matt Slater comes, he comes and says what's going on in Albany, that type of thing. So just a recommendation. Thank you.

Councilman Christian Russo

Wanted to comment on the septic replacement program and thank Senator Matt Slater and Senator Rob Rolison for their continued efforts. They both took their time to come to Putnam Valley Town Hall and meet with the residents, and made a Big Difference. They discussed septic systems and water quality, which made a big difference. Thanks to their efforts, Barger Pond, Lake Oscawana, and Lake Peekskill have been included in round 5 of DEC's Septic System Replacement Fund Program. This is an important step in protecting our lakes and supporting our homeowners. In January of this year, thanks to our County Executive, our Board of Health Director, Rian Rodriguez, confirmed that these lakes are included in round 5 funding and further requested the release of funds for these lake communities. Back in July of 2025, Kathy Hochul announced that the funding would be available, but we're still waiting on the details regarding the amount and the timing of the release. I will be sending a letter to request updates to urge continued advocacy so that these funds are delivered promptly and in a way that makes septic upgrades affordable for our residents. This is about protecting our lakes, our environment, and our communities.
